TALLYING2016HU4KVOLUNTEERHOURSAT OUR PARTNER SCHOOLS

Together in 2016, we delivered a massive **3,851.5 hours** to helping students at Partner schools, which equates to **\$125,352** when applying the widely accepted volunteer rate of \$35 p/hr. WELL DONE!



Of the 16 Partner Schools operating in 2016, 7 schools had 10 or more volunteers (the largest was 15 volunteers who clocked up c whopping 533.5 hours at Maidens Park PS!) 6 schools had 8 or 9 volunteers and 3 had fewer than 7, the lowest number being 4 at Treendale who were just starting out. The average works out to 9 in a team.

TEACHER SURVEYS (33 returned)

RESPONSES: OUTSTANDING far outweighed all other comments in relation to

- i) I value the HU4K program and the contribution of the volunteers
- ii) The school admin team values the HU4K program and the contribution volunteers make
- iii) Students enjoy and value the HU4K program CONSIDERABLE
- iv) Although it is difficult to measure the impact of HU4K on students' reading skills evidence indicates that this reading assistance valueadds to the students.

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STUDENT SURVEYS - 334 surveys returned

i) 80% I like reading at home

- ii) 79% I want to keep reading with a volunteer next year
- iii) 75% I enjoy reading to my HU4K volunteer
- iv) 75% I think I am better at trying new words since reading with my volunteer
- v) 73% I think my reading has improved since I started reading to my volunteer
- vi) 73% I think I am a better reader since reading with my volunteer
- vii) 60% I do home reading every day

VOLUNTEER SURVEYS (52 surveys retuned)

- i) 92% It is personally satisfying to be part of HU4K plus 4% responded moderately
- ii) 92% It is personally satisfying to see children's reading confidence improve plus 2% indicate moderately
- 89% The class teacher values the HU4K program and my contribution and a further 6% indicate moderately
- iv) 89% I believe that the school Admin team values the HU4K program and the contribution of volunteers and a further 10% indicate moderately
- v) 83% It is important for me to be part of a community project and a further 17% indicated moderately
- vi) 80% Students enjoy and value the HU4K program and a further 15% responded "moderately"
- vii) 78% The school is prepared for the program and has strategies in place to accommodate change and a further 9% indicate moderately so
- viii) 75% It is important to me to be part of a team plus 20% indicate "considerable important "
- ix) 70% indicate they do not feel that their presence is a disruption to the class and a

further 15% feel their presence is a moderate disruption

- x) 68% I am satisfied with the level of support I receive from the HU4K Coordinator and a further 26% indicate they are moderately satisfied (and 1% not at all satisfied)
- xi) 59% I believe that that the reading skills of the students I work with have improved as a result of the HU4K program plus 28% indicate "considerably important"
- xii) 45% indicate that more training would <u>not</u> be beneficial in helping them do their job better and 28% indicate more training could be beneficial

SCHOOL CONTACT PERSON SURVEY (6 returned)

- School Admin teams value the HU4K program and the contribution of volunteers: 5 Strongly, 1 Moderately
- ii) The HU4K program is a strategy in the school Literacy Plan: 4 Yes, 1 No,1 Limited
- Class teachers value the HU4K program and the contribution of volunteers: 3 Strongly, 2 Considerably, 1 Moderately
- iv) The HU4K volunteers have developed a strong partnership with the school, based on understanding and mutual respect: 3 Excellent, 2 Considerable, 1 Moderate
- v) Volunteers have made a significant contribution to the literacy program offered at the school: 2 Yes, 2 Considerable, 1 Moderate
- vi) Evidence indicates that HU4K reading assistance value-adds to the school's curriculum: 1 Significantly, 3 Considerably, 1 Moderately, 1 Limited
- vii) Students enjoy and value the HU4K program: 5 Considerably, 1 Moderately

There are some excellent comments in these responses (despite the low return rate in

some instances). Every HU4K volunteer should be proud of his/her contribution!
